These Regulations do NOT relate to what duty was owed in respect of Grammar schools, but rather how they were to be funded - which led to a change of categorisation of such schools and hence which safety regime applied to them.

Under Regulation 2 Direct Grants to Grammar Schools were phased out. Grammar schools were given the choice of either becoming maintained by the LA (in which case they would then fall into the regime for 'LEA maintained' within this table) or of becoming wholly independent: I can find no regulations pertinent to standards in Independent Schools prior to 2003.

Insofar as they became wholly independent, then they appear to have fallen out of this system entirely. The numbers of schools overall involved was, in any event, relatively small.

Of the 154 direct grant schools, 51 agreed to become comprehensive schools within the maintained system; the rest opted for independence^v

Thus, although the Direct Grant Schools Regulations 1959 (SI 1959/1832) were not formally revoked until 1998 (see below) — not least because they also contained provisions regarding teacher training, they probably ceased to have

Whilst in researching for this table, it has not been possible to find the precise relationship between the non-grammar direct grant schools and the *Direct Grant Grammar Schools (Cessation of Grant)* Regulations 1975 (SI 1975/1998) it assumed to be unlikely that their existence as either non-LA or non-fully-independent schools continued for any longer than that of the Grammar Schools
